Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

With a population of over 1.1 million inhabitants, the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois has tens of thousands of people in our midst living in poverty. These men, women and children seldom make the headlines. However, their needs are real and deserve our prayer, action, and financial support.

Our annual Diocesan Collection for Justice and Hope (DCJH) will be taken the weekend of November 18-19, 2023. This collection gives Catholics an opportunity to reach out in solidarity to those who suffer and lack basic human necessities. All funds donated during the DCJH collection are granted to organizations that give realistic hope to the poor to break out of the cycle of poverty.

Like all Catholic ministries, the DCJH grant program reaches out to the broader community, without regard to race, ethnicity or religion. This campaign seeks to address the Gospel command to care for "the least of these" (Matthew 25), and also address the systemic injustices that contribute to poverty.

Please give generously to this DCJH collection and, when possible, reach out in service and solidarity to those organizations that help the poor among us.

Please contact the office if you would like to register with St. Rose of Lima Parish.

- Parish registration is required to be a Catholic in good standing.
- Some Sacraments, (Baptism, First Communion, Confirmation, Holy Matrimony), are administered through your parish. The permission of your pastor is required for these Sacraments to be administered elsewhere.
- Parish registration is not hereditary, (v.g. no file-sharing allowed). Register with us if you are your own household and not registered with another parish.
- St. Rose is a personal parish without territorial boundaries, so registration is open to all Catholics residing in the Catholic Diocese of Springfield in Illinois. The Bishop allows dual membership, i.e., one can be registered with St. Rose as well as with another parish of the diocese.
- The “pro populo” Masses on Sundays and Holy Days are offered for the intentions of the parishioners.
- In addition to their canonical rights, parishioners will also receive emails, mailings, etc.

Those associated with St. Rose who reside outside of the Catholic Diocese of Springfield in Illinois may also submit a registration form to participate in parish activities, receive emails, mailings, have their donations recorded, etc. Permission of your local pastor is required for the Sacraments of Baptism, First Communion, Holy Matrimony, or any other right reserved by local law.
